English

In English, our new narrative unit will be, 'The Invisible' by Tom Percival. The Invisible is the story of a young girl called Isabel and her family who have to move home due to money difficulties. It is an important story about how we all have the right to belong. Some of the key writing features we will focus on are: personification, writing using colons and semi-colons, repetition for effect, using brackets to add further information. Spelling lists continue to be on our website for your reference.

Maths

Year 3: We shall be learning how to add and subtract money before moving onto telling the time, initially, to the nearest 5 minutes and then to the nearest minute. We will finish the year with shape work: reviewing 2 and 3D shapes, studying angles and learning about parallel and perpendicular lines.

Year 3/4:

In Coelho we will be returning to develop our earlier work on fractions. We will be looking at decimals, which will link into our work on fractions. Also we will look at time, both analogue and digital.

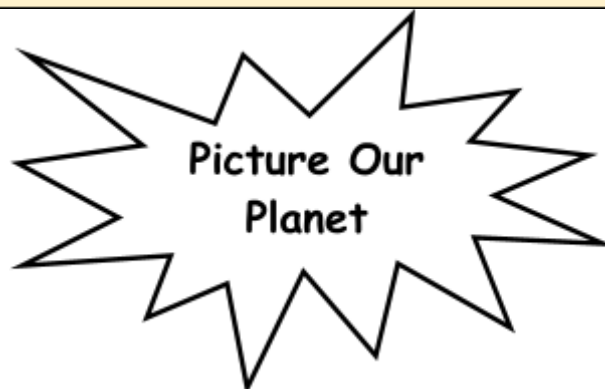

Learning Means the World – Our Wider Curriculum

Picture Our Planet

This unit focused on geography and the learning is centred around three contrasting localities: Brazil, Scotland and Fiji. Children will learn key facts, physical and human features, traditions and customs and gain an insight into how each country is tackling particular conservation issues.

Pupils will have the opportunity to look at a range of sources and evidence and make comparisons.

Our science learning is focused on sound. The children will learn to identify how sounds are made, know that vibrations from sounds travel through a medium to the ear and to recognise patterns between the volume of a sound and the strength of the vibrations that produced it. As part of our Brazil unit, we will learn about Romero Britto, a Brazilian born pop artist. In PSHE we will encourage the children to reflect on their own spending choices and understand why financial management and planning is important from a young age
