Learning Means The World - British Bulldog and Fighting Footballer

This term, children will continue to explore the inspiring story of Winston Churchill before moving onto the fascinating story of Walter Tull. They will learn how Churchill led Britain to victory in World War II and motivated the nation through his powerful speeches. Pupils will also discover how Walter Tull broke barriers as one of the first Black professional footballers and a commissioned British Army officer. With a focus on history, the unit also includes links to art, drama, and PSHE, encouraging reflection on prejudice, equality, and societal change over time.

English - The Write Stuff: This term's writing unit will be based on 'Scott of the Antarctic' by Evelyn & Julian Dowdeswell, in this non-fiction diary unit the children will be working through the Writing Rainbow, looking at tenses, feelings and figurative language. At the end of the unit the children will complete their own diary as one of Scott's crew members, using features they have learnt throughout the topic. Our short unit will be a non-chronological report based on the Antarctic.

PE -

The children's Monday PE sessions will be led by sports coaches. Children will be taught skills in Basketball, learning about different ball handling skills such as dribbling, passing and catching.

During their indoor PE sessions the children will be continuing the above skills through handball.



Maths - Maths Mastery (White Rose Maths)

Addition and Subtraction - The children will be looking at mental strategies, using the inverse and multi-step problems.

Multiplication and Division - The children will look at factors and factor pairs then develop knowledge on prime, square and cube number, before beginning to multiply and divide 4 digit numbers.

Year 6 will be covering the same topics, but will go further into long division.

The children will also be completing weekly short arithmetic tests.



RE - ODBE Schools

This term, our big question is: "How do people make valid judgements about how and why the world is as it is"

The children will explore their knowledge of the world explained by both faith and science, while continuing to link back to the big question.
