Curriculum Newsletter Summer Term 1 2025



English

This term Year 5 will be looking at the book 'The Lion above the Door' by Onjaili Rauf. The children will be using similes, dialogue and idioms and are working towards their independent write in which they will be writing a powerful speech to their classmates about the importance women and/or other cultures in World War 2.

As Year 6 work towards their end of KS2 writing assessment, we are covering a number of different genres and objectives including; a non-chronological report about the planet Pandora; a short adventure story 'The door to ...' and a pep talk letter addressed to year 5!

Maths

In Zephaniah class the focus is currently firmly on revision with an emphasis on arithmetic, we have also been working on calculating the perimeter, area and volume of shapes, ratio and scale factors.

In Rundell class the focus will be on revision in the run up to SATs examinations, making sure they feel confident to answer a range of different questions.


In Palmer class we will be looking decimals and Geometry, in which we will be focusing on shape and position and direction

All classes now complete a separate daily retrieval practice in Maths where we revisit previous knowledge and practise key skills.

<u>PE</u>

This term in PE the children will be working on their Handball skills as well as getting to practice some Net and Wall games, focusing on hand eye coordination.

The Year 5s will also begin their swimming sessions this term.



RE - What might a Hindu gain from a pilgrimage to India?
