

Please see below some Learning Means The World home learning activity ideas linked to our Summer 1 topics about Mary Anning and Sir Ranulph Fiennes.

Link to learning	Mary Anning showed real commitment in the way that she didn't give up when her work was rejected by so many geological societies and Ranulph Fiennes demonstrated real commitment in the way he completed The Transglobe Expedition.	Today the Natural History Museum in London showcases several of Mary Anning's spectacular finds, including her ichthyosaur, plesiosaur and pterosaur. Much like they did two centuries ago, her fossils continue to captivate visitors from around the world.	Mary's legacy lives on along the rugged Jurassic Coast - now a UNESCO World Heritage Site - where scientists, amateurs and adventurous children alike gather year-round to hunt for the next big find.	It is often claimed that Mary Anning's fossil hunting story was the inspiration for the 1908 tongue twister, 'She Sells Seashells'.	Ranulph Fiennes showed dedication to charity communities by completing expeditions to raise money for them.
Activity idea	Write about a time where you have had to persevere and never give up.	Visit the Natural History Museum.	Go fossil hunting along the Jurassic Coast.	Practise some tongue twisters. Can you make up your own tongue twister?	Think of a way to make money for other people, e.g. making and selling bracelets to raise money for a charity.
Link to learning	Use different sources of information to find out about the past.	Research about Mary Anning and Sir Ranulph Fiennes.	Mary Anning taught herself geology, anatomy and scientific illustration when no-one else would teach her.	An explorer goes on a journey for a purpose.	In 1984, Sir Ranulph Fiennes was described by the Guinness World Record's editor as "The World's Greatest Living Explorer."
Activity idea	Sequence events from your life in order as a booklet or timeline (e.g. when you were born, learnt to walk, a special party).	Write a fact file/ non-chronological report about Mary Anning and Sir Ranulph Fiennes.	Try to learn a new skill.	Write a list or draw and label things to pack for an expedition.	Look at other world records, can you try and beat one?
