Learning Means The World - Come Fly With Me, America!

“Global Warning” is a thematic unit, which is geography-focused with sustainability and eco literacy at its heart. This project-based theme involves the children learning about the global environmental issues of waste and pollution and thinking about different ways to tackle these issues. Throughout the unit we will be looking at different types of pollution and pollutants, and gaining a better understanding between waste and pollution, as well as looking into sustainability and recycling



English

This term, Year 5 will be focusing on non-fiction newspaper report writing, using the Titanic as our stimulus. We will be looking at the key features and the layout of newspaper reports as we sentence stack our own article about the day the Titanic set sail.

Year 6 are continuing to prepare for the end of year writing assessment teacher judgements by revisiting work to edit and improve it and/or writing shorter pieces with a very specific focus.

PE Year 5 will be honing their rounders skills this term and with the MNR coaches, year 5 and 6 will be practising their net and wall skills through a variety of different net and wall games.

Year 6 will be developing their core swimming strokes, and learning self-rescue and water safety skills.
