School's responsibilities

- Provide an inspiring, inclusive and safe learning environment, where your child feels valued, cared for, respected and listened to, in line with our Christian Ethos
- Ensure that your child reaches their fullest potential in terms of academic standards and attitude to learning
- Develop your child's sense of self-respect, respect and consideration for others and for the environment
- Provide a broad and balanced curriculum that fulfils the requirements of the National Curriculum and meets the individual needs of your child
- Broaden the scope of the curriculum by providing a wide range of extra-curricular activities
- Provide homework opportunities that are realistic, achievable and linked to topics in class
- Keep you informed about what your child is learning, their progress and behaviour and help you understand how to support them at home
- Be open, welcoming and offer you opportunities to exchange information, ask questions, express views and be involved in the life of the school
- Value and celebrate individual achievements
- Promote good attendance and punctuality
- Encourage your child to develop confidence, self-esteem, and resilience
- Maintain high expectations for learning and behaviour



Parent / Carer's responsibilities

- Having chosen Trinity for your child, positively support the school by promoting Trinity's aims, values, policies and procedures
- Ensure your child comes to school punctually every day during Term time, unless there is a good reason for absence (e.g. illness)
- Notify the school office each day, before 9:00am, in the event of absence
- Send your child to school in correct, clean, labelled uniform / PE kit (see website for details)
- Promptly inform the school of any concerns or problems that may affect your child's learning, well-being, behaviour or happiness at school
- Support your child's learning through regular reading and homework activities at home
- Attend parents' evenings and other progress and information meetings
- Be prepared to volunteer and support the school by offering your time or skills when possible
- Talk to your child about school, what they have been learning and support their learning at home
- Keep emergency contact details up to date and keep the school office informed of any health concerns or allergies
- Respect school property that is sent home, e.g. reading books, and replace / cover the cost of lost or damaged school property
- Read information on the website and communications from the school office / class teacher and respond in a timely fashion, where required
- Treat staff with respect and have honest communications with the school in line with our Christian values; particularly around any absences during term time
- To address any concerns directly and respectfully with the school and to refrain from openly criticising members of the school on WhatsApp groups or social media
- Support the schools' Behaviour Policy, working with the school to create a safe and inclusive learning environment for all pupils



Pupil's Responsibilities

- Follow the school rules and demonstrate the school values
- Be respectful towards others (teachers, staff and peers) and behave in a safe, considerate and responsible way
- Wear your school uniform with pride
- Cooperate with your teachers and always try to do your best
- Let your teacher know or talk to a grown-up if you have any worries
- Take good care of the school building, grounds and equipment, as well as your own belongings - keep the school tidy
- Read at home and do all your classwork and homework as well as you can, asking questions when you don't understand
- Think of others and take care of your own and other people's health and safety
- Come to school on time, every day, ready to learn
- Be proud of who you are and what you can achieve, showing resilience and perseverance when approaching new learning
- When possible, participate in outside of school community activities representing Trinity
- Year 6 only: Not to be in possession of a mobile phone on the school site and to hand it into the office before the start of the school day
